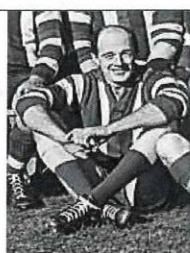
History of Avoca Under 15 & Under 16 team.

The Avoca Under 15 team first played matches in 1964 when the Lexton Football League introduced a 3rd 18 team to the competition.

In the 55 years that Avoca has played in the junior competition, we have only missed the finals on 7 occasions in the 3rd 18 competition.

This is an outstanding feat, but the disappointment of these 55 years of playing of in the finals, is the fact that we have only won 6 premierships, from 19 appearances in the Grand Final and we have not played in a Grand Final since 2003, when we were Runners Up for the fourth successive season.

Avoca played Beaufort in the 1964 Grand Final but unfortunately was defeated by a 55 point margin.



Bob Eastman

The 1964 Coach was Bob Eastman.

Bob was senior coach in 1958 and won the club Best & Fairest in 1959.

Our first ever captain was George Wardlaw, who also won the club Best & Fairest award.

Two of George's son's would also achieve this feat in later years.

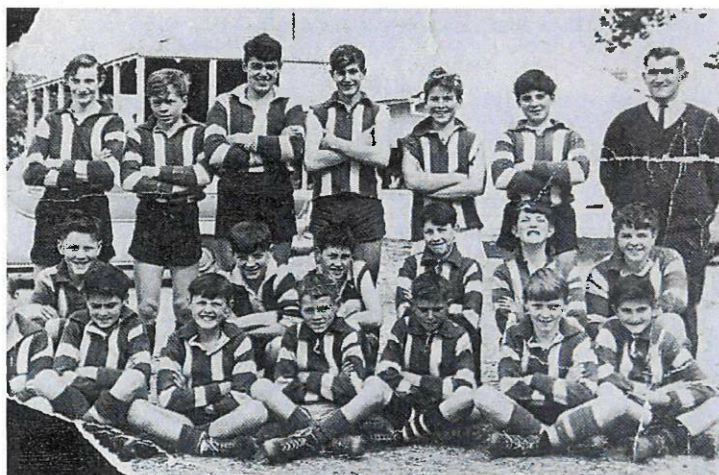
Gary won the B & F in 1989 in a premiership year, and Michael won the B & F in 1991.

1964 was also our first of 19 Grand Final appearances.

1965 saw Avoca finish 3rd after the home & away season and once again go on to play of in the Grand Final .

Unfortunately we were defeated in the Grand Final by arch rival Natte-Bealiba by the smallest possible margin of 1 point. N-B 5.10.40 def Avoca 5.9.39

The 1965 team was coached by Jim McKenzie, Jim was a member of the 1953 Senior Premiership team. Jim's son, Garry, was Captain and also won the the 1965 under 15 club Best & Fairest award.

Col Evans was assistant Coach.
Col has played for Avoca and coached many teams over the years.

He coached the Avoca Reserves team to a premiership in 1962, and won the Reserves club Best & Fairest awards in 1961 and 1963.
Col also won the Reserves L.F.L Best & Fairest in 1965 and was Runner up in 1967.

Col was made a Life Member of the A.F.C in 1981 for outstanding service to the club.

1966 saw the team finish 3rd after being beaten by Navarre in the Preliminary final.

After finishing the 1967 season on top of the ladder, we did not even play of in the Grand Final after we were defeated by Landsborough in the preliminary final.
We were favourites to go all the way. But it was not to be.



Jim Jess

1968 was the first time that we failed to make the finals over our 55 year history.

This was also the year that Jim Jess was Captain of the team and he was also voted the Best & Fairest player.

Jim, went on to be a club legend with Avoca, and also played 223 games with Richmond F.C and represented Victoria on a number of occasions.

Jim was awarded Life Membership of the Avoca Football Club in 1997.

After finishing 3rd on % after the H & A season in 1969, we were defeated by 4th placed Lexton in the 1st semi final by 5 points. Lexton went on to win the Grand Final by defeating the favourite Waubra by 7 points.

The Best & Fairest player was Dale Farnsworth who was also Runner Up in the L.F.L Best & Fairest award.

The winner was Dennis Ross of Natte-Bealiba.

Dennis later coached Avoca seniors in 1978 to 3rd position.

1970,71 was not a very successful season with the team finishing just out of the finals.

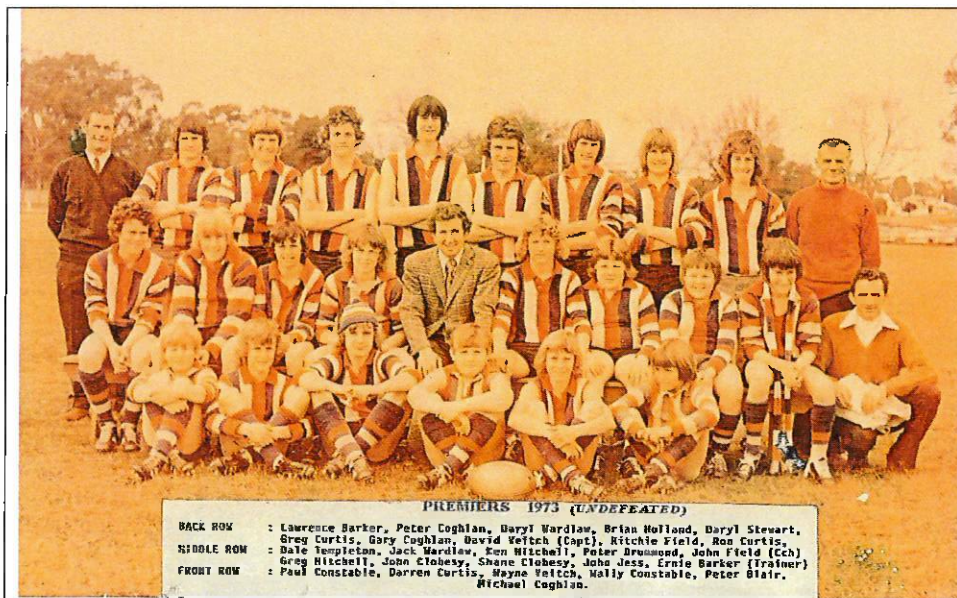
1972 saw the start of a successful era under the guidance of coach John Field.

Although we were defeated in the 1972 Preliminary final by Natte-Bealiba, the ground work had been done to form the foundation of a very successful team over the next few seasons.



1972 Under 15 team

The Under 15 team won its first ever premiership in 1973.
We not only won the premiership, but also went through the season undefeated.



David Veitch

David was captain and was also best player in the Grand final.

Avoca 12.13.85 defeated Moonambel 1.1.7

Unfortunately the goalkickers were not kept for this game.

Best players were David Veitch, Richard Field, John Jess, Wallace Constable, Wayne Veitch, Dale Templeton, Daryl Stewart, Peter Drummond, Greg Mitchell, Gary Coghlan, Greg Curtis, and Brian Holland in a very even side.

The 1973 Premier & Champion team was coached by John Field, and was captained by current under 16 coach, David Veitch. David was also the best player in the Grand Final.

1973 was also the first year of 5 years in succession of playing in the Grand Final.

More success was to follow in 1974 when the team won its 2nd premiership back to back. Once again going through the season undefeated, and holding the opposition scoreless on 9 occasions.

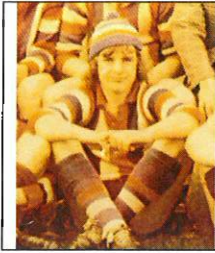

The 1974 Under 15's were once again coached by John Field, and were captained by Jack Wardlaw.

The best player in the Grand Final was Peter Coghlan.



Wayne Veitch polled a massive 116 votes to win the club Best & Fairest and also became the 1st Avoca player to win the League Best & Fairest with 35 votes.

Wayne backed up in 1975 to win the Reserves L.F.L Best & Fairest award.

A number of players in the 1973,1974 Champion teams went on to play in premierships in the Senior & Reserves Grades for Avoca.

Peter Drummond has played in 4 Premierships for Avoca, 2 Senior, 2 under 15 and has been amongst the Best players on each occasion.

1974 was the year that John Field was awarded Life membership of the Avoca Football Club.

John has been a devoted servant to the club for over 40 years.

John won the Reserves Grade Best & Fairest in 1960 & 1962 and was Runner Up in the senior grade Best & Fairest in 1964. He was also a member of the Reserves Grade Premiership in 1962.

He was coach of the Under 15's from 1972 to 1975, resulting in 2 premierships and a Runner Up once. He was also the coach of the reserves grade Premiership team in 1979.

He first became President of the club in 1967, and has held that position on 13 occasions until stepping down in season 2001. Apart from holding the position of President, he was also Secretary on 7 occasions and has been a committee member for over 30 years.



John Field

John Field received the highest accolade possible in the year 2000, when he was awarded the Australian Sport Medal from the Victorian Country Football League for outstanding service to Country Football.

Unfortunately the Under 15's couldn't make it 3 in a row in 1975, going down to Navarre in the Grand Final by a solitary point after being down by 12 points at ¾ time.

John Jess kicked 6 out of 8 goals in the Grand Final.

John also has the enviable record of playing in 11 Grand Final teams for Avoca Football Club and has played in 7 premierships.

3 seniors, 2 reserves, 2 under 15.

He once kicked 16 goals in a senior game vs Moonambel in 1982.

John also coached Avoca reserves to Back to Back premierships in 1996,1997.

John was awarded Life membership of the Avoca Football Club in 1997.

1976 saw Jon Howell take over the reins as coach of the team, and we played of in the Grand Final once again, for the 4th year in succession. Unfortunately we were defeated by Landsborough by 13 goals.

Avoca were favourite to win this game as we were only defeated once during the season, which was by Landsborough in the first round by 2 points. Avoca defeated Landsborough by 10 goals just before the finals.

Phil McKechnie won the club Best & Fairest and was runner up in the L.F.L Best & Fairest by 3 votes.

1976 also saw former Under 15 Premiership players, Wayne Veitch and John Jess invited to train with St Kilda F.C.

The team would play of in their 5th Grand Final in a row in 1977. Success!
The team won its 3rd ever premiership by defeating Navarre by 2 points.

The Premiership Coach was Jon Howell.

Paul Constable was Captain.

The Best & Fairest award was won by Paul Constable.

Paul kicked 14 out of the 24 goals scored during the finals.



Best in the 1977 Grand Final was Wayde Thiele.

Wayde later put his name in the history books for Avoca by kicking the winning goal after the siren, in the 1979 Reserves 2nd semi final from 60 metres out on the boundary line, the torpedo punt sailed through at goal post height.

This put Avoca into the Grand Final and they went on to win their first Premiership since 1962. 17 years!

1978 was the end of our run of Grand Final playoffs, when Lexton defeated Avoca in the Preliminary Final.

Avoca were favoured to win the flag after finishing the home & away season on top of the ladder and only being defeated twice during the year. Lexton by 2 points and Navarre by 1 point.

The team was coached by Gerald Meagher.

The 1978 Lexton Football League Best & Fairest awards were dominated by Avoca Players with David Edwards winning the award with 19 votes, Greg Jess was 2nd with 18 votes and Wayde Thiele was 4th with 16 votes.

This was the first of many accolades that David Edwards would achieve with the Avoca Football Club.

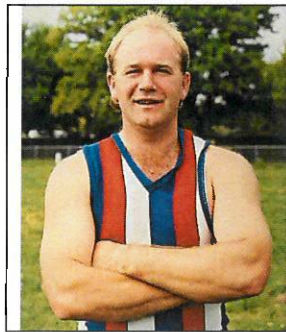
David has played in 5 club premierships. 1 under 16, 1 reserves, 3 seniors.
Played in the 1980 senior grade premiership as a 16 year old and was amongst best players.

He has played in excess of 250 total games for the club.

He has won 7 senior grade club Best & Fairest awards.

In 1993, David won the senior grade L.F.L Best & Fairest award, was Runner up in 1989, and again in 1994.

And of course, as previously stated, he won the 1978 under 15 L.F.L Best & Fairest.



David Edwards is widely regarded as one of the greatest players to ever play for the Avoca Football Club in its 130 year history.

David's team mate, Greg Jess would win the Reserves grade L.F.L Best & Fairest in 1981.

1979 saw the Under 15 competition change to an under 16 competition.

The Under 16's were defeated by Navarre in the 1st semi final.

Craig Trickey was Runner Up in the L.F.L Best & Fairest award.



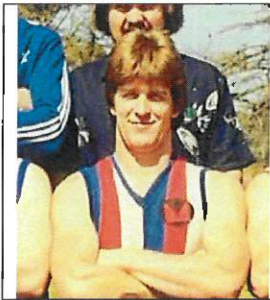
1979 Under 16 team

David Veitch was Coach of the Under 16's in 1980 and 1981. Unfortunately the team just missed the finals in 1980 finishing in 5th place, but 1981 saw the team improve to equal 2nd (3rd on %) after the home & away season, but were defeated by Marnoo in the 1st semi final.

1980,81 is also the years that Avoca seniors would enjoy back to back senior grade premierships, with 1980 being our first premiership since 1953. 27 years.



Peter Drummond was the best on the ground in the 1980 Senior Grand Final and won the Ballarat Courier award for being the Best Player.

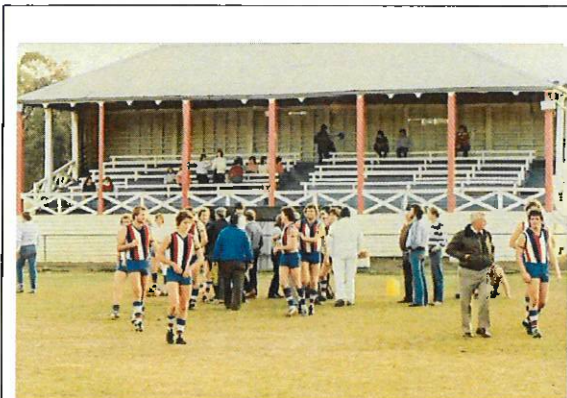
Peter, or Perce as he was affectionately known, also took an outstanding mark in which he was standing on the shoulders of an opposition player.

Perce is widely regarded as arguably, the Best Full Back that has ever played for Avoca.

1982 saw senior grade 1980,81 premiership player Leon Bradley, take over the coaching role from David Veitch, who also played in the 1980,81 senior grade premierships.

The Under 16 team finished in 3rd place after being defeated by top side Landsborough in the Preliminary Final.

1982 was also the year that the old Avoca grandstand mysteriously burnt down.

1982 Under 16 team

Leon Bradley was once again at the helm in 1983.

The team finished the home and away season on top of the ladder, but were thrashed by Marnoo in the 2nd semi final and then saw the season come to an abrupt end when they lost the Preliminary Final to Dunolly.



Richard Field Bill Drummond

Craig Drummond was the winner of the L.F.L Best & Fairest award in 1983 with 32 votes.

Greg Wardlaw was tied for 2nd place with Neil Robinson of Natte-Bealiba with 24 votes.

1973 Under 15 Premiers & Champion team member, Richard Field tied for the 1983 Senior grade L.F.L Best & Fairest with Steve Kirby of Lexton.

1984 saw the Under 16's win 7 out of the first 10 games, only to lose every game for the rest of the season and miss the finals, finishing in 5th place.

Darren Curtis, who was a member of the 1977 Under 15 premiership side was appointed Under 16's Coach in 1985.

The team finished the home and away season in 2nd position, but were defeated by Marnoo in the Grand Final. Marnoo 7.6.48 to Avoca 5.1.31

Marnoo were undefeated for the season and finished Premiers & Champions.

Paul Medwell won the L.F.L Best & Fairest award with 29 votes.
Dean Jolly finished 3rd with 20 votes.

David Veitch was Senior Grade coach in 1985,86, and records show that David kicked 11 goals in a game vs Dunolly on 3.8.85.

After the disappointment of losing the 1985 Grand Final to Marnoo, It was to be a repeat in 1986, with Avoca losing by 49 points to Marnoo in the 1986 Grand Final.
Marnoo 11.5.71 to Avoca 2.10.22.

Geoff Calder

Geoff Calder was appointed Coach in 1987.

Geoff is highly regarded at the Avoca Football Club and was instrumental in Avoca winning Back to Back senior grade premierships in 1980,81.

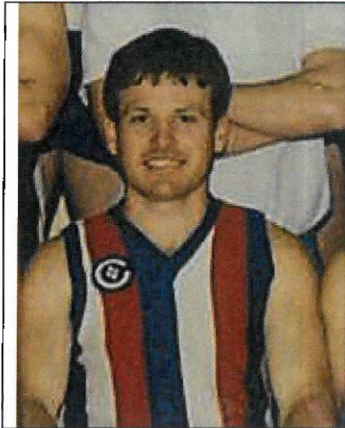
He held the position of Secretary in 1979,80,81 and played a major role in recruiting. He also coached the Under 16's to a premiership in 1989, and was the best player for Avoca in the 1979 Reserves Premiership.

In 1990, Geoff, along with David Veitch and Ken Beavis he would be awarded Life membership of the Avoca Football Club for dedicated and outstanding service over many years..

In 1987, the team finished equal 2nd with Natte-Bealiba (3rd on %), only to lose to Natte in the Preliminary Final. Natte-Bealiba's Mark Cossar (L.F.L B & F) played an outstanding game and totally won the game of his own boot.

1988 saw Lexton finish in 2nd place ahead of Avoca by % after the Home & Away season. Avoca were unfortunately beaten by Navarre in the Preliminary Final.

Scott Howell won the club Best & Fairest award and was Runner Up in the L.F.L Best & Fairest award with 21 votes.



Scott Howell has played a total of 286 club games for Avoca, and during that time he has played in 4 senior grade premierships, Won 3 senior grade Best & Fairest awards and been Runner Up on 2 occasions. Won the Under 16 B & F in 1988. He also won the senior grade LFL Maffescioni award in 1992. Scott was joint senior coach in 2000 and forced to retire in 2001 due to a severe knee injury he suffered half way through the season. Scott assisted David Veitch with the 2002 Under 16's and later coached the Under 14.5 for three seasons from 2013 to 2015. He has also been football co-ordinator for a number of years. Scott was presented with Life Membership in season 2018.

After promising plenty over the past few years, 1989 saw the Avoca Under 16's win their first premiership for 12 years. The last being in 1977.

Avoca defeated Navarre in the Grand Final to finish the season as the Premier & Champion team by going through the season undefeated.

Geoff Calder was coach of the 1989 Premier & Champion team.
Gary Wardlaw was Best & Fairest player.

Geoff Calder has been widely praised as a junior coach for his ability to prepare junior players for the rigours of Senior grade football.
8 players of the 1989 team would go on to play in the 1993 senior grade premiership.
Warren Howell, Craig Jolly, Mark Blair, Julian Field, Brad, Gary, Mick & Paul Wardlaw.

Brett Cole was Runner Up in the 1989 L.F.L Best & Fairest award with 20 votes, losing by only 2 votes.

1990 saw the team finish in 2nd place after the home & away season.
Innaccurate kicking cost the team dearly in the 2nd semi final losing to Natte-Bealiba.
Natte-Bealiba 6.8.44 to Avoca 4.15.39

Unfortunately, we would not get the opportunity to extract revenge on Natte, as we were defeated in the Preliminary Final by Dunolly.

1990 was also the year that Life Memberships were presented to Dave Veitch, Geoff Calder and Ken Beavis.



Ken Beavis was President in 1979,80,81, a trainer for over 20 years, and has been an outstanding supporter of the club for more than 35 years.

Both David and Geoff have played a major role in the development of Avoca players for many years.

A brief history of Geoff's contribution is figured earlier in this booklet.

David Veitch has given many years to the Avoca Football Club as a player, coach, and committee member.

He first started playing with the Under 15's about 1969 and was Captain of the 1973 Under 15 team, that were the undefeated Premiers & Champion team.

He played in Senior Grade Grand Finals in 1979,80,81.
79 - Runner Up 80,81 Premierships.

He was coach of the Under 15's in 1980,81 and is currently coaching the Under 16's in season 2002.

Dave was also the senior grade coach in 1985 & 1986

Dave has played in excess of 250 total club games, coached in excess of 100 games and has been an outstanding contributor to the Avoca Football Club, both on and off the field for many years.

He is very proud of his Life Membership and is a very worthy recipient.

Avoca defeated Natte-Bealiba in the 2nd semi final and go into the Grand Final as favourites to win our 5th premiership in 1991, unfortunately it was not the case, and instead we would be Runner Up for the 7th time after Natte-Bealiba defeated Avoca in the Grand Final in a very high scoring game.

Michael Wardlaw won the 1991 club Best & Fairest award by 2 votes from Julian Field. Both these players would develop into outstanding players for the Avoca Football Club in future years.

Michael would win the Senior Grade Club Best & Fairest award in 1995 and play in 4 senior grade Premierships.



Julian Field would play in the 1993 senior grade premiership and was best on the ground in the 1994 Runner Up team.

Only for a extensive shoulder injury, Julian could quite possibly have been drafted to the A.F.L, however he was recruited to the North Ballarat Football Club in the Victorian Football League, where he was an outstanding player.

While playing for North Ballarat, Julian has won the club Best & Fairest on 2 occasions and was also the Liston Medalist. V.F.L Best & Fairest.

After the disappointment of losing the 1991 Grand Final, 1992 would see John Veugelers become only the 4th coach to win the Under 16 Premiership for the Avoca Football Club.

After totally destroying the Dunolly team by 23 goals in the Preliminary Final, the team went into the Grand Final full of confidence.

Avoca defeated Landsborough in the Grand Final.

Avoca 7.6.48 defeated Landsborough 2.7.19

The team finished 3rd in 1993, losing the Preliminary Final to Landsborough by 1 goal.

1993 was the year that club legend, Jim Jess, returned to the club to Coach the Avoca Football Club senior grade to its 1st premiership since 1981. 12 years.

8 players from our 1989 Under 16 premiership team played in this senior grade premiership, along with 3 players from the 1992 Under 16 Premiership team.

After recharging his batteries, Geoff Calder returned as Coach of the Under 16 team in 1994. We finished in 2nd position after the home & away season and were favoured to play of in the Grand Final against top team Landsborough.

Unfortunately, Landsborough gave us a football lesson in the 2nd semi final and then Navarre repeated the dose in the Preliminary Final defeating us by 10 goals and demolishing a few players ego's in the process.

The team would progress to the Grand Final in 1995 and would play Dunolly, which would be the 1st of 3 consecutive years that these two teams would meet in the Grand Final.

Unfortunately, Dunolly would take the honours on this occasion and Avoca would be Runner Up for the 8th time in a very close game which Dunolly won by 3 points.
