Netball – A, B & C Grade, 17 & Under, 15 & Under, 13 & Under and 11 & Under.



As a player at the Avoca FNC you are expected to participate in training activities, adhere to our uniform policy and ensure that you are on time on match days. Our club colours are royal blue, red and white.

Club Uniform

The football club uniform consists of royal blue shorts and a royal blue, red and white striped football jumper with royal blue, red and white striped socks. All football players are provided with a jumper, however they need to purchase their own shorts & socks.

The netball club uniform is a blue shift dress with blue shorts, or shorts, skirt, tee-shirt or singlet. A dress is provided to players who join the club. If a player wishes to wear shorts or a skirt, they are able to purchase these themselves via our online store. Returning players are able to keep their uniform. Players leaving the club must return their uniform at the end of the season. Sunglasses are permitted but must be wrap-around style. Gloves are only permitted with a medical certificate. They must be cotton.

Training times - Netball

Training for Senior Netball is conducted on Thursday nights commencing at 6.30pm. Junior netball is conducted on Thursday night from 4.10pm (starting with Under 11 & Under 13).

Training times - Football

Training is held at the Avoca Public Park on nights specified by coaching staff for pre-season.

Training commences at 6.00pm on Tuesday and Thursday nights for Senior & Reserve teams.

Junior training commences at 4.00pm on Thursdays.

Player Registration

Before a player takes to the ground or court, they must complete player registrations online through PlayHQ or Netball Connect. All players who complete their online membership registration agree to the Club's terms and conditions (viewable online in PlayHQ and Netball Connect).

Players not registered with the MCDFNL are not eligible to commence playing for the AFNC. All players at the AFNC are also required to pay a club membership. By Club policy, clearances will be denied to players who have NOT PAID membership in full and/or returned club uniform.

Digital Membership Cards

The AFNC provides all registered members with a digital membership card. You must have a digital membership card to gain entry into home games. Volunteers will scan the QR code on your membership card at the gate. If you cannot present your digital membership card, you must pay the gate entry fee of \$10.

Votes & Player Selection

The AFNC allows the Football & Netball Managers, in conjunction with coaches, to select, at their discretion, people present on the day to award votes.

These people may be from our Club or the opposition and have been chosen to undertake this role with no bias. The Club also has an independent person tally votes throughout the season. The AFNC fully endorses the coaches' philosophy of player selection. Players or parents with concerns regarding these processes are encouraged to speak to the football or netball managers.

Match starting times

All players are expected to be prepared for match days by ensuring they have appropriate footwear (including laces), uniform and injury equipment (if required).

Players are expected to be present on match days at least 30 minutes before a game is due to start.

Match starting times may vary for junior grades depending on who we are playing. It is important for all players and parents to have TeamApp or join the relevant messenger group to stay up-to-date with changes.

What makes up my playing membership?


All player memberships are made up of the following:

- AFNC Club Membership \$80 (seniors only)
- MCDFNL Registration \$20 seniors / \$10 juniors (all players)
- AFL Victoria Registration (footballers) \$70 seniors / \$45 juniors
- Netball Victoria Registration (netballers) \$80.00 seniors / \$60.00 juniors (not collected by AFNC)
- Uniform allowance \$20 per person (all players)
- Umpires \$50 per player (seniors)
- GST

The Club covers the cost of trainers and medical supplies for all players and does not pass this cost on.

- Trainers \$ 50 per player
- Medical Tape/supplies \$25 per player

The costs to run our club are significant each year. Your membership fees are a critical income source to ensure we manage the clubs operational expenses.



Medical Indemnity / Player Insurance

The Avoca FNC takes occupational health and safety seriously and aims to provide all players with a safe environment for participation. All players must complete a medical indemnity form that includes emergency contact details, Ambulance Victoria membership and health insurance (if applicable) information. This information is kept confidential and stored safely for emergencies only.

The AFNC takes out the recommended AFL Victoria, National Insurance Program standard player insurance through JLT Sport for all footballers. Netballers are covered through Netball Victoria's insurance program. The insurance provides a percentage of reimbursement for items that are not claimable in any way through Medicare or a Private Health Fund for injuries that occur as a direct result of playing sports with the AFNC.

The AFNC does not pay any out-of-pocket expenses not covered by Medicare or JLT Sport Insurance. All injuries must be reported immediately to the Club Insurance Officer, Team Medical Officer or Football / Netball Manager. If applicable, request a claim form for completion. The Avoca FNC requires all players to have current Ambulance Victoria membership. In an emergency and an ambulance is called, the Club WILL NOT be responsible for any out-of-pocket costs incurred if that player does not have the required Ambulance cover. The AFNC does not have income protection for loss of income and will not be liable.

The Club can however arrange cover for loss of income cover through their insurers for individuals who may require this type of cover at their own expense. Creating a safe environment

All members of the Avoca Football Netball Club are expected to act in accordance with the Club's Constitution and to adhere to our Policies and Code of Positive Behaviour. All members that complete a membership form have agreed in writing to adhere to this Code. Any members that breach the Code may come before the Disciplinary Committee.

- 1. Members and players will at all times when representing the club in any capacity, whether that be playing or attending club functions are expected to do so in a manner which will not bring the image of the Avoca Football & Netball Club into disrepute.
- 2. We will support opportunities for participation in all aspects of football & netball.
- 3.We will respect the rights and worth of every person regardless of their age, race, gender, ability, cultural background, sexual or religious preference.
- 4. We will show respect and courtesy to all persons involved with our Club and our League including officials, coaches and administrators.
- 5. We will display appropriate and responsible behaviour in all our interactions and act with integrity and objectivity when representing our club and always in accordance with Club policies.
- 6. We will ensure our decisions and actions contribute to a safe and harassment free environment. We will not tolerate abusive, bullying or threatening behavior.

PLAYERS

- 1. We will give our best at all times.
- 2. We will participate for our own enjoyment and benefit.
- 3. We will play by the rules and show respect for other players, coaches and officials.

Creating a safe environment

COACHES

- 1. We will place the safety and welfare of the players above all else.
- 2. We will help each person (player, official, etc.) to reach their potential. Respect the talent, developmental stage and goals of each person and encourage them with positive and constructive feedback.
- 3. We will obtain appropriate qualifications and keep up-to-date with the latest coaching practices and principles of growth and development of young players.

OFFICIALS

- 1. We will place the safety and welfare of the players above all else.
- 2. We will ensure all players are included and can participate, regardless of their race, gender, ability, cultural background, sexual or religious preference.
- 3. We will be consistent, impartial and objective when making decisions.
- 4. We will address unsporting behaviour and promote respect for all players and officials.

ADMINISTRATORS

- 1. We will ensure quality supervision and instruction for players.
- 2. We will support coaches and officials to improve their skills and competencies.
- 3. We will act honestly, in good faith and in the best interests of our Club as a whole.
- 4. We will ensure that any information acquired or advantage gained from the position is not used improperly.
- 5. We will conduct club responsibilities with due care, competence and diligence.

Creating a safe environment

PARENTS, MEMBERS & SUPPORTERS

- 1. We will encourage children to participate, do their best and have fun.
- 2. We will focus on a child's effort and performance, rather than winning or losing.
- We will speak with other parents, coaches, or committee members about any concerns we have about the behaviour or actions of children. We will not approach a child on their own.
- 4. We will not ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing in competition.
- 5. Where possible, we will help out the coach or officials at training and games.
- 6. We will model appropriate behaviour, including respect for other players and officials.
- 7. We will respect the effort and performances of players and officials.
- 8. We will reject the use of harassment, bullying or violence in any form, whether by other spectators, coaches, officials or athletes





AVOCA FOOTBALL NETBALL CLUB COMMITMENT TO CHILD SAFTEY

What can you expect from our Club?

Football and Netball should be fun, safe and enjoyable.

You should never feel uncomfortable around others, particularly adults.

If you don't feel safe or comfortable, it's OK to speak up and tell someone you trust.



Positive Guidance

You should expect to be treated fairly and respectfully. It's not ok to be treated in a way that's cruel, frightening or humiliating.



Supervision

You should never be unsupervised, and adults will always ensure you are in a safe environment and protected from external dangers.



Physical Contact

Any physical contact must be appropriate to the activity you're involved in. No contact should be initiated if it is against your wishes.



Communication

Any communication with you should be about football or netball activities only and preferably verbal or through TeamApp.



Gift Giving

You should not be receiving gifts from anyone in a position of responsibility unless parents or guardians have been made aware.



Change Rooms

People in positions of responsibility are required to supervise children and young people in change rooms, but you do have a right to privacy.



Language and Tone of Voice

Adults should boost your confidence and encourage you. It's never ok for them to be discriminatory, racist, sexist, negative, threatening or frightening.



Photography

You have the right not be photographed and it should only be done with yours and your parents or carers permission. It should also be done in the presence of other adults.



Alcohol or drugs

The supply of alcohol or drugs (including tobacco) is strictly prohibited. You can expect no person carrying out a role will use or be in possession of an illegal drug or alcohol.

Policies

The AFNC has several policies that support the Club's Constitution. You can view our policies at any time on our website, or by asking a member of the Executive Committee. A summary of our policies include:

Alcohol Management - The AFNC encourages the responsible serving and consumption of alcohol.

Illegal Drugs - The AFNC has an illicit drug policy that will be actively enforced.

Smoke & Vape Free - The Avoca Public Park (by the Tobacco Reforms Act) has a 10m smoke-free exclusion zone around all playing and spectator areas and the main Complex building during all junior matches.

Vilification - The AFNC does not tolerate any form of vilification. Members or patrons will act on our policy at all times.

Memberships Policy - All members are required to adhere to our membership policy.

Social Media - The AFNC encourages the safe and responsible use of social media sites such as Facebook and Twitter. The Club will protect all members from bullying or inappropriate behaviour on social media.

Child Safe Standards - The AFNC has adopted the recommended standards for child protection.

Life Members - The AFNC has a life membership policy to manage the induction of any life members to the organisation.

Football & Netball Trips Policy - This policy applies to senior netball and football trips.

Being a member of our Club

Rosters

The age-old saying "Many hands make light work" truly exists within our Club. There are so many roles and tasks that must be undertaken every week to ensure the Club runs efficiently and effectively.

There are many rosters that are put together each year to ensure the weekly jobs are undertaken at the Club. These rosters include the gate, canteen, bar, scoring, timekeeping, umpiring, and selling raffle tickets, to name a few.

If you have been rostered to complete a job, please make every effort to complete your rostered time slot. If you are unavailable, you must arrange a swap or contact the roster manager for the area immediately. **PLEASE DO NOT JUST NOT SHOW UP** and hope that someone else will fill your role. It puts a large strain on our existing volunteers if they always have to fill positions with people who just didn't bother to help.

Players may also miss playing time if they or their parents do not complete their roster duty.

Formal Complaints and Grievances Policy

The AFNC Committee welcomes and encourages feedback from its general members and supporters. All committee members, coaches, players, and members are reminded that they are bound by our code of conduct and supporting policies. If they breach the code, they may find themselves facing disciplinary action in accordance with the Complaints & Grievances Policy.

Players and parents are entitled to speak directly with their coach regarding any issues or concerns they may have, but it is advised that no discussions should be held on game day, especially if the coach happens to be a player. If they are unsatisfied with the outcome, they are encouraged to speak to the Football Manager, Netball Manager, Junior Football Development Manager, or the Club President.

Being a member of our Club

There is a process to go through for formal incident reporting or complaints, so please contact a member of the Club Executive if you wish to provide the Club with this type of feedback. You can also review the Policy on our website.

Photo Indemnity

The AFNC requires all players to complete online photography indemnity approval that states whether they agree or not to have their photograph taken/video filmed during the H&A season along with the finals series. Every player must check this box on the online registration form.
