Football Report

The 2019 season started with great anticipation, with the playing group training in Ballarat early in the pre-season with strong numbers present. Our coaches remained the same as season 2018 with AJ Bourke and Damien Scott coaching the senior group and Mick Dury the reserves; strong results early in the season up to around eight saw us in an enviable position, however, due to a number of player injuries and unavailability, saw consecutive losses to teams we should have been competitive against.

In assessing our seasons performance a number of factors have been identified including an aging list and an over-reliance on out of town players, on a positive note for the club this provided an opportunity for a number of our local juniors to step up and have a taste of senior football which should hold us in good stead going forward in the future. A particularly pleasing aspect of the season was the quality of football played by our local juniors, which displays the strength of our junior development program within the club.

Whilst not having the results we were after this season, from a club perspective the year was incident-free and I'm particularly happy with the way our senior and reserves group gelled throughout the year.

The Reserves with Mick Dury as coach had a great year, culminating with them going deep into the finals, being beaten only in the semi final in trying conditions, fielding teams most week with their playing list being depleted due to having to step up and fill holes in our senior team, they can take great satisfaction on their 2019 season.

Moving forward we have put in place a coaching development plan which was implemented in October and will be used as a template for all future football coaching appointments. Recruiting for next year is well underway, at this stage we have 16 names who have been contacted and discussions are ongoing; After all the hard work put in by the committee, coaches and players this year, "I believe we are become the club of choice".

I would once again like to thank the committee for their continued support during the year, with them being so supportive to all the new idea's raised during the season by the Football Executive. A massive Congratulations to the Netball girls, they have set the standard to which we have to aspire to in 2020.

Netball Report

2019 was a very successful year for Avoca Football Netball Club, with A grade and B Grade both winning premierships for the club. B Grade came from 5th place and had several close games against Natte, Lexton and Navarre before defeating Harcourt in the Grandfinal by ten goals. A Grade, on the other hand, were undefeated all year and as predicted came up against Carrisbrook in the Grandfinal. As the girls did all year, they stuck together, supported each and played as a cohesive unit to defeat Carrisbrook by eight goals.

C Grade, U17s, and U11s also competed in the finals. Even though C Grade lost one of their defenders during the finals, they managed to make it to the Semi-Finals before being defeated by Maryborough Rovers in a toughly contested game by three goals. The U17s won the elimination final by one goal in time on against Harcourt and continued to play strong in the Semi-Finals defeating Maldon by 15 goals however Talbot proved to be too strong in the Preliminary finals defeating the girls by just one goal.

This is the first year that Avoca has had an U11s side and the girls made the club proud by making it to the Semi-Finals in their first year. It is great to see such great potential at a young age coming up through our grades.

Although U13s and U15s didn't make it into the finals, the teams are to be commended on their attitude, teamwork and support they showed for each other during the 2019 season.

2019 saw Sarah Eldridge take on our youngest grades of Netball coaching the Net Set Go and U11s team. Sarah has done a wonderful job of introducing the girls to the game and developing their basic skills. The benefit of having an U11s team this year is that it will avoid our young girls that are too old for Net Set Go, competing at the Maryborough Complex. Instead, we can keep them playing at the club and developing a positive club culture at a young age. I want to thank Sarah for her hard work and commitment she has put into these development grades.

I'd also like to thank Stacey Blair and Wendy Robertson for coaching the U13s team. With Stacey's experience on the court and Wendy's coaching experience off the court, they were a dynamic duo. With their guidance, the girls went from shooting an average of four goals a game to shooting 20 goals in the last game. There was a significant difference in the girls' skills, ability and confidence from the start of the year to the end which can only be contributed to Stacey and Wendy's commitment and expertise.

Bridie Flagg had the toughest coaching job of all, with over 15 girls in this age bracket. With U17s being short on numbers, we decided to place three girls in U17s permanently to help Bridie rotate players in U15s. The structure over the past two years has ensured that girls in U11s, U13s and U15s are given equal game time to ensure everyone gets a fair go and the chance to develop their skills. I want to thank Bridie for her hard work and passion for developing our junior girls and encouraging them to achieve their goals.

I'd also like to thank Charlotte Barber, Hayley Bearpark and Paige Scott for playing in a higher grade for the entire season, ensuring we had enough numbers and putting their club and team before themselves, which was much appreciated.

The last Junior Coach I would like to acknowledge is Sam Wardlaw who returned to coaching after a couple of years break. Sam was dedicated to her U17s team all year and managed to get them to the Preliminary Finals and was unfortunately pipped by just one goal. Your hard work and effort is very much appreciated by all at the club.

Congratulations and thanks also to our senior coaches in Maddy Egan, Kerry Egan and Christie Chapple. There was a strong focus on fitness and endurance this year. The Coaches knew that they had a talented bunch of girls but thought in the past fitness is what let them down come finals. With the coaches dedication and

commitment, they achieved the ultimate success with two Premierships. The club is very proud of you and thank you for your hard work.

2019 was the first year that we held try-outs for the Avoca netball senior grades. Any junior players that came up through our junior teams were automatically accepted; however, everyone else had to try out. We found this to be a successful exercise and achieved the outcomes we desired. We not only acquired a high calibre of players, but it also avoided having excessive numbers.

The Netball Exec have already received some coaching applications for Junior and Senior grades next year with meetings and announcements to be made in due course.

We continue to have a strong executive structure, and we are grateful to have so many dedicated members to assist with running our netball programs. Thanks to all involved with special mention to Simone Field, Donna Wardlaw, Stacey Blair and Colleen Drummond for all of their behind the scenes work in keeping the netball operations running smoothly.

Memberships
